POLIO	An infection that affects nerves and can cause muscles to not work
POLYCYSTIC KIDNEY DISEASE	A condition from birth that causes growths in the organ that cleans the blood and makes urine
POLYCYTHEMIA	A condition of having too many red blood cells
POLYDACTYLY	A condition from birth of having extra toes or fingers
POLYNEUROPATHY	Pain caused by damage to many nerves
POLYSOMNOGRAM STUDY	A test done to see how a person breathes when asleep
POLYURIA	A condition when a person makes too much urine
POSITRON EMISSION TOMOGRAPHY (PET) SCAN	A test that uses a special dye to take a picture of the inside of the body
POST HERPETIC NEUROPATHY	A condition of nerve pain caused by a virus
POST TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER (PTSD)	A condition of high levels of fear and worry from a shocking event
POSTHITIS	A condition of painful swelling on the tip of the male sex organ
POSTURAL DRAINAGE	A treatment to clear the lungs by moving the body in a downward position
POSTURAL HYPOTENSION	Low blood pressure when rising from lying or sitting down
PREMATURE BIRTH	A baby born before 37 weeks of pregnancy
PREMENSTRUAL SYNDROME (PMS)	Mood changes and body pain before a period
PRESSURE ULCER	An open wound from being in one position too long
PRIMARY CILIARY DYSKINESIA	A condition present at birth where hair-like structures in the lungs do not work right
PRIMARY LATERAL SCLEROSIS	A brain disease that causes muscle weakness
PROCTOSIGMOIDOSCOPY	A procedure to look at the inside a small part of the large bowel
PROPHYLACTIC MASTECTOMY	A surgery to remove breast tissue to lower the risk of breast cancer
PROSTATITIS	The condition caused by swellling of a male sex organ
PROSTHESIS	A body part made for one person to replace a missing part



PSORIASIS	A condition of red, dry patches of skin
PSORIATIC ARTHRITIS	A condition causing painful joint swelling with red, dry patches of skin
PSYCHIATRIC EVALUATION	A visit with a special doctor to see how a person thinks and feels
PSYCHOLOGICAL TREATMENT	A service to help a person cope with their emotions and thoughts
PTERYGIUM	A growth on the white part of the eye
PULMONARY EMBOLISM	A blood clot in the lungs
PULMONARY FUNCTION TEST	A test to see how well the lungs work
PULMONARY INSUFFICIENCY	A condition where a valve in the heart does not work right
PULMONARY STENOSIS	A condition in which the flow of blood from the heart to the lungs is slowed down
PULSE OXIMETER	A device that measures the gas in blood that maintains life
QUADRIPARESIS	Weakness of both arms and legs
QUADRIPLEGIA	Inability to use both arms and legs
RACZ PROCEDURE	A procedure to help relieve pain in the spine
RADIATION	A treatment used to kill cancer cells
RADICULITIS	Painful swelling of a nerve
RADICULOPATHY	A group of conditions when one or more nerves do not work right
RADIOALLERGOSORBENT (RAST) TEST	A special blood test to see if a person reacts to something
RADIOFREQUENCY ABLATION (RFA)	A treatment used to destroy tissue
RADIOLOGIST	A special doctor who looks at pictures of the inside of the body
RAYNAUD'S SYNDROME	A condition that causes parts of the body to become numb and cool
REACTIVE AIRWAY DISEASE (RAD)	A group of conditions that cause problems breathing
RECEPTIVE EXPRESSIVE LANGUAGE DISORDER	A condition that causes problems talking and knowing what is being said
RECTOCELE	When the end of the large bowel bulges into the female sex organ
RECTUM	The end of the large bowel
REDUCTION MAMMOPLASTY	A surgery to make the breasts smaller



REDUNDANT FORESKIN	Extra foreskin on the male sex organ
NEDUNDANI FORESKIN	A condition that causes painful swelling and skin
REFLEX SYMPATHETIC DYSTROPHY (RSD)	changes
REFLEX	When the body moves by itself in reaction to something
REHABILITATION	A set of exercises to help the body heal and return to normal
REMISSION	The time when a long-term disease is not active
RENAL FAILURE	A condition when the organs that clean the blood and make urine stop working
REPOSITIONING THERAPY	Turning a sleeping baby often to help reshape the head
RESPIRATORY FAILURE	A condition when the organs that help a person breathe stop working
RESPIRATORY SYNCYTIAL VIRUS (RSV)	A virus that can cause breathing problems in babies and small children
RESPIRATORY SYSTEM	The set of organs that help a person breathe
RESTLESS LEG SYNDROME (RLS)	An urge to move the legs while at rest
RHEUMATOID ARTHRITIS	A long-term condition that causes painful swelling of small joints
RHEUMATOLOGIST	A special doctor who treats diseases in which a body attacks its own cells
RHINECTOMY	A surgery to remove part of the nose
RHINITIS	Swelling of the airways in the nose
RHINOPLASTY	A surgery to change the shape of the nose
RHIZOTOMY	A surgery to destroy problematic nerves
RANGE OF MOTION (ROM)	The normal way a joint moves
ROSACEA	A long-term condition causing redness and bumps on the face
ROTATOR CUFF	A group of muscles that hold the shoulder in place
SCIATICA	A condition causing pain from the lower back to the leg due to a pinched nerve
SCLERODERMA	A long term skin condition caused by the body attacking its own cells
SCLEROSIS	Hardening of a body part
SCLEROTHERAPY	A treatment used for making swollen veins smaller

SHINGLES	An infection from a virus that causes a painful rash with blisters
SHORT STATURE	A condition when a child is much shorter than other children of the same age
SHOWER CHAIR	A chair used to help keep a person safe while they take a shower
SHUNT	A device to drain fluid from an area of the body
SICKLE CELL ANEMIA	A condition from birth causing too many red blood cells that are not normal
SIMPLY THICK	A brand of powder used to make liquids more solid
SINGLE PHOTON EMISSION COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY (SPECT) SCAN	A special kind of picture that measures blood flow to organs or tissue
SINUSITIS	A condition of swelling in the air spaces in the skull
SKIN TAG	A small piece of extra tissue that grows on the body
SLEEP APNEA	A condition that causes a person to stop breathing when asleep
SLEEP DISORDER	A condition that causes a person to have trouble sleeping

SLEEP STUDY	A test done to see how a person breathes when asleep
SLING OPERATION	A surgery to keep the bladder in place
SMARTVEST AIRWAY CLEARANCE SYSTEM	A brand of device that helps clear the lungs of extra mucus
SPASM	The sudden tightening of a muscle that cannot be controlled
SPASTIC	A burst of muscle activity that cannot be controlled
SPEECH DELAY	A condition when a child cannot speak like children of the same age
SPEECH THERAPY	A service to help a person talk better
SPINA BIFIDA	A condition from birth due to problems with the brain or spinal cord
SPINAL CORD STIMULATOR	A device placed near the backbone used to treat long-term pain
SPINAL STENOSIS	Narrowing of the area that holds the spinal cord
SPIROMETRY	A test to see how well the lungs work
SPONDYLOLISTHESIS	A condition where one backbone is out of place
SPONDYLOSIS	Wear and tear of the backbone
STEATOHEPATITIS	A condition caused by too much fat in the liver
STENOSIS	A blood vessel or other body part that is too narrow to work right
STENT	A tiny tube placed in a blood vessel or duct to keep it open
STRABISUMUS	A condition that causes the eyes to be crossed
STRESS INCONTINENCE	A condition when urine leaks while coughing or moving around
STRESS TEST	A test used to evaluate blood flow to the heart during exercise
SUBLUXATION	A condition caused by a bone being out of place
SUPPORT HOSE	Special stockings
SUPRAVENTRICULAR TACHYCARDIA (SVT)	A condition that causes the heart to beat dangerously fast
SWEAT CHLORIDE TEST	A blood test to check for a lung problem causing thick mucus
SYNCOPE	Fainting



TACHYCARDIA	A heartbeat that is faster than normal
TALIPES VALGUS	A condition when the inner side of the foot rests on the ground
TEMPOROMANDIBULAR JOINT (TMJ) DISORDER	A group of conditions that cause pain in the jaw
TENDON	Tissue that connects muscle to bone
TENDONITIS	A condition caused by swelling of the tissue that connects muscle to bone
TETRALOGY OF FALLOT	A group of four types of heart problems present at birth
THORACOSCOPY	A procedure to look inside the chest using a special camera
THORACOTOMY	A surgery to cut into the chest wall
THROMBOCYTOPENIA	A condition when the blood has too few pieces of blood cells to form clots and stop bleeding
THYROID	A gland in the neck that makes chemicals the body needs to work right
THYROIDECTOMY	A surgery to take out the neck gland that makes chemicals which the body needs to work right
TINEA CORPORIS	Ringworm
TINEA PEDIS	Athlete's foot
TINEA VESICOLOR	A condition caused by a skin infection
TINNITUS	A ringing sound in the ears
TONSIL	Tissue at the back of the throat that helps fight infection
TONSILLECTOMY	A surgery to take out the tissue at the back of the throat that helps fight infection
TONSILLITIS	Swelling of the tissue at the back of the throat that helps fight infection
TORSION DYSTONIA	Painful twisting and tightening of muscles
TOTAL PARENTERAL NUTRITION (TPN)	A liquid given through a blood vessel to replace food
TRACHEA	Windpipe
TRACHEAL SUCTION CATHETER	A device used to remove mucus from the windpipe
TRACHEOSTOMY	A surgery to make an opening through the neck into the windpipe



TRACHEOSTOMY SPEAKING VALVES	A device used to help a person talk
TRACTION	The use of steady pulling force to treat muscle and bone problems
TRANSISCHEMIC ATTACK (TIA)	Small stroke
TRANSCUTANEOUS ELECTRICAL NERVE STIMULATION (TENS) UNIT	A device that uses an electric current to block pain
TRANSFER BENCH	A device used to help a person get in and out of a bathtub or shower
TRANSESOPHAGEAL ECHOCARDIOGRAM (TEE)	A test where pictures are taken of the heart through the food pipe
TRANSSEXUALISM	A condition where a person wants to be the other gender
TRAPEZE BAR	A device over a bed that helps a person to sit up or move around
TREMOR	Twitching of one or more parts of the body
TRIGGER POINTS	Muscle knots that cause pain
TRIGLYCERIDE	A type of fat in blood
TUBAL LIGATION	A surgery to stop pregnancy
TUMOR	A growth
TURBINATE REDUCTION	A surgery to the nasal airways to help a person breathe better
TYMPANOMETRY	A test to check for fluid in the middle ear
TYMPANOSTOMY	A surgery to place tubes inside the eardrum to drain fluid from the middle ear
ULCERATIVE COLITIS	A long-term condition of the bowel causing painful swelling and sores
ULTRASOUND	A special picture of the inside the body using sound waves
UPPER GASTROINTESTINAL SERIES	A group of tests that look at the inside of the body from the food pipe to the small bowel
URETHRA	A tube in the body that drains urine from the bladder
URINARY OBSTRUCTION	A condition when the urine flow is blocked
URINARY TRACT INFECTION (UTI)	A condition caused by germs in the body parts that make and empty urine
URODYNAMIC TESTING	A test that checks how well the bladder holds and empties urine

UROLOGIST	A special doctor who treats the body parts that make and empty urine
URTICARIA	A rash
UTERINE ACTIVITY MONITOR	A device used to measure the movement of the baby in the womb
UTERINE FIBROIDS	Growths inside the womb that are not normal
UTERUS	Womb
VALGUS	A bone turned outward
VARICOSE VEINS	Blood vessels that are twisted and swollen
VARUS	A bone turned inward
VASCULITIS	A condition due to swelling of a blood vessel
VASECTOMY	A surgery on the male sex organ to prevent pregnancy
VENOUS INSUFFICIENCY	A condition when the blood vessels in the legs cannot return blood to the heart
VENTRICULAR SEPTAL DEFECT (VSD)	A hole in the heart that is not normal
VERTEBROPLASTY	A procedure to fix a broken backbone
VERTIGO	Dizziness
VESICOURETERAL REFLUX	A condition when urine flows back into the kidneys
VEST AIRWAY CLEARANCE SYSTEM	A device that helps clear the lungs of extra mucus
VESTIBULAR CUDDLE SWING	A special hanging device to help children to have better balance
VESTIBULAR PHYSICAL THERAPY	Special exercises that help a person have better balance
VIDEO CAPSULE ENDOSCOPY	A test using a small camera which is swallowed to look inside the body
VITILIGO	A condition in which the skin loses color causing white patches
VOIDING CYSTOURETHROGRAM (VCUG)	A special picture of the bladder while a person urinates
VON WILLEBRAND DISEASE	A condition present from birth that causes bleeding that is not normal
WALKER	A metal, four-legged frame to help a person walk safely
WEIGHTED VEST	A type of clothing used to help a child calm down and learn better



WHEELCHAIRHEAVY DUTY	A wheeled device for people that weigh over 250 pounds
WHEELCHAIRPOWER	A wheeled device with a motor that lets a person move around
WHEELCHAIRSTANDARD MANUAL	A device that lets a person move around while turning the wheels by hand
WHEEZING	A whistling sound during breathing caused by mucus
WOUND VAC	A special device that helps heal a large area of skin that has been cut or torn
XANTHELASMA	A condition that causes yellow bumps around the eyes
X-RAY	A special picture of the inside of the body
